Keynote Address

Gregory Bruni
Llano Estacado Winery

Greg Bruni spent 12 years as a head winemaker in the California Central Coast before his move to Texas to become Winemaker at Llano Estacado Winery in 1993. The move to Texas was based on a passion to produce premium wines and pioneer new wine regions.

"When I first visited Texas," said Bruni, "I found everything that had first inspired me to become a winemaker. Much like the California Central Coast in the '1970's and 1980's, Texas is bursting with potential".

Greg represents the third generation of his family to work in the wine industry. His family founded the San Martin Winery where Greg began working as a boy. The work in the cellars, vineyards and tasting room did not immediately appeal to Greg; eventually it was the science of wine (enology) that drew Greg to attend U.C. Davis where he obtained a B.S. degree in Fermentation Science.

His arrival at Llano Estacado 21 years ago marked a turning point for the winemaker and the winery. Working with the extraordinary team at Llano, they have continued to produce award- winning wines that receive national and international acclaim.
